

MINUTES OF AN EXTRAORDINARY MEETING

held at

THE CLERK'S RESIDENCE

on

JULY 24th 2001 at 7. 30 p. m.

PRESENT: Councillor Mrs. P. Blackman and Cllrs. Messrs. Bain, Furness, , Maple, Page, Stokes and the Clerk.

APOLOGIES: Cllr. Goddard sent his apologies. He had prior commitments.
Cllr. Pringle had business travel commitments. These apologies were accepted.
Cllr. Potts was not in attendance.

FINANCES: The Audit papers for the year ending March 3st 2002 being due for submission before the next scheduled meeting, in September, and the Chairman's signature and date of the Council's approval of the Balance Sheet also being required, this extraordinary meeting was called.

The Clerk had circulated copies of the Income & Expenditure Account and the Balance Sheet to all council, together with the Notice of the Meeting, on July 18th.

It was proposed by Cllr. Page, seconded by Cllr. Bain and unanimously agreed that the Balance Sheet be approved and signed. The Chairman and Clerk [in his capacity of Responsible Financial Officer] duly signed.

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The Clerk took the opportunity to mention that Councillors Page and Bain had signed the cheque for reimbursement to the Clerk of the sum of £570.33 for his payment made to Kentish Messenger Group Newspapers, as agreed at the previous meeting. This was due to be formally approved at the September meeting.

Cllr. Blackman referred to overhanging shrubbery outside 72 Ashford Road.

Cllr. Black reported problems over the use of the interavailability of return tickets on Poynters and Stagecoach services. She was following up on this matter.
